Target – 1:1 **Katsina** – 1:1

Targets – 100% **Katsina** – 7.7%



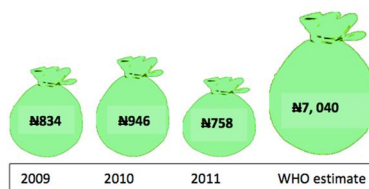
% of population aged 15-49 years with comprehensive correct knowledge of HIV/AIDS
